

## **COVID-19** update

In keeping with NSW Health directives, anyone attending a church now must wear a face mask. Children under the age of 12 are exempt from this rule, but are encouraged to wear face masks where practicable.

NSW Health can impose a \$200 fine on each individual failing to abide by this rule.

Up to 100 people can attend Masses as well as other ceremonies including funerals, baptisms and weddings, providing a four square metre rule is observed.

QR codes are now compulsory for churches to ensure there is a record kept for all attendees. However in cases where you have parishioners unable to use a QR code, in these cases, the parish must keep an electronic record of that person's name and contact details.

The Baptism of the Lord / B 10 January 2021



"You are my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on you"

In a sermon quoted in the Spiritual Reading (Office of Readings) for this Sunday's Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, one of the great early Church Fathers St Gregory Nazianzen (329-390), drew out the significance for us of this momentous event in Jesus' life:

Christ is bathed in light; let us also be bathed in light. Christ is baptized; let us go down with him and rise

Over the centuries, artists have painted this event using the symbolic imagery present in the Gospels, focusing of course on Jesus himself being baptised by John. However, while all this has produced great works of art, it misses one very important feature of Jesus' baptism. Jesus would not have been there on his own nor would he most likely have stood out from the many people who came to be baptised by John. We could imagine him there on the banks of the Jordan together with people just like himself, waiting in the hot sun for his turn to be baptised, not pushing himself forward or expecting some kind of special treatment, even though John was his cousin.

This is consistent with Jesus' way throughout his life, beginning with his humble birth in a stable at Bethlehem. We will see him preaching and healing as we listen to Mark's Gospel throughout this year but, even though others may be amazed at what they see and hear, he does not draw attention to himself but to God's work through him. The next time we will hear Jesus called "the Son, the Beloved" will be at the Transfiguration and then later from the Roman centurion as he hung lifeless on the cross, finally revealing his divinity through his humanity.

All of this should impress upon us the significance of our own baptism, as St Gregory reminds us. Through Baptism, we "participate in the grace of Christ....as an 'adopted son' we can henceforth call God 'Father' in union with the only Son (and) receive the life of the Spirit who breathes charity into us, forming the Church" (Catechism of the Catholic Church #1997). For most of us, this extraordinary gift from God is given to us at a time when we are least able to grasp its importance, when we are babies. Perhaps this is why we take it so much for granted as a 'given' in our life, something that is done to us and for us rather than as an invitation to grow into a unique way of life.

Baptism is in the end God's claim on us, a gift that we have done nothing to deserve, no matter at what stage of life we are baptised. It is a responsibility 'to grow into' throughout our lives as we experience new opportunities to live as sons and daughters of God. Many would come to listen to God's "voice" through Jesus because his life spoke to them with a unique authority. If we who are baptised 'speak' like everyone else, should anyone bother to pay attention and listen to us?
