

# "Go and teach all people my gospel. I am with you always until the end of the world"



In April 1961, at the height of the Cold War, Russia scored a major victory over the United States when it became the first nation to send a man into outer space. In what was intended to be a second propaganda victory, the astronaut, Yuri Gagarin, was quoted as saying, "Why do we cling to God? I flew into space and didn't see God." In fact, Yuri said nothing of the sort. These words were attributed to him in order to promote atheism among young people who were impressed by Yuri's achievement. Yuri himself was a baptised Orthodox Christian, although a secret one because of his role. A lifelong friend of his remembered him saying, "an astronaut cannot be suspended in space and not have God in his mind and his heart."

We all need to contend with a 'materialist' understanding of God and spirituality in general as we celebrate today's Feast of the

Ascension of the Lord. Generations of artists have depicted Jesus being "lifted up while the disciples looked on and a cloud took him from their sight" in the way our painting does. Even Break Open the Word, the commentary our readers use, says "modern readers may find themselves mentally dissenting from the ancient cosmology that has Jesus ascending into the sky."

The account of Jesus' ascension that we have in the Acts of the Apostles and in Mark's Gospel isn't however as simple and as 'physical' as it seems. For a start, mention of 'clouds', 'angels', being 'lifted up' should make us realise that the language here is the language of the mysterious presence of God in both the Old and New Testaments. Remember God giving the Law to Moses on Mt Sinai which was shrouded in cloud and mist; Jesus at the Transfiguration when a cloud came and overshadowed him and his disciples.

The key therefore to understanding both the meaning and the significance of the Ascension for us is, as Bishop Robert Barron puts it in his article "Why the Ascension of the Lord matters."

To recover the Jewish sense of heaven and earth... We tend to set up a sharp distinction between spiritual and material... between the fleeting earth, this 'valley of tears' and the permanent heaven... These convictions have far more to do with Plato than with the Bible.

The Bible speaks about 'heaven' and 'earth' but these two 'worlds' interact with each other. The 'world' or dimension of God and the angels, "touches upon and calls out to earth, the 'world', the dimension of humans, plants, animals and planets... Salvation therefore is about the meeting of heaven and earth so that God might reign as thoroughly here as he does on high." This is what we mean when we pray, using Jesus' prayer, "thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

The Feast of the Ascension leads us to Pentecost and the beginning of the Church through the concluding words of Mark's Gospel, "...after Jesus was taken up into heaven ... (the disciples) .... preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word by the signs that accompanied it." The Church, Bishop Barron notes, "is the privileged place where this coming together of heaven and earth happens."

Our own parish community and our parish church is a microcosm of this 'coming together', the people and the place where, in the words of the Easter hymn, the Exsultet, "heaven is wedded to earth/and man is reconciled with God." The church is not some all purpose 'gathering space'. The building and all that it contains speak of the living presence of God in our part of the world. God is present in the Stations of the Cross. They remind us that "God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son." God is present in the statues of the saints, people who in their own lives "proclaimed the Good News to all creation" and who live now with God interceding for us. God is present in the lives of the people who come to worship there, people who are drawn 'from the ends of the earth' to pray and to receive Christ in the Eucharist so that, like the apostles, "the Lord may work with them and confirm the word by signs that accompany it."


