The Most Holy BODY and BLOOD of CHRIST (Corpus Christi) / B

"A thanksgiving sacrifice I make: I will call on the Lord's name"

In April 1975 as American helicopters were ferrying people out of Saigon before the communist North Vietnamese entered the city, Francis Xavier Nguyen Van Thuan arrived as the new Archbishop of Saigon. There was no one to meet him. Worse was to follow. In August he was arrested and then imprisoned in Nha Trang, a city where he had previously been Bishop. He was to spend the following nine years there in a narrow cell with nothing to do and in solitary confinement.



Each night he would hear the bells of what had once been his cathedral but this made him feel even more helpless and forgotten. He found prayer difficult but he prayed simple prayers to Jesus, "Jesus on the cross, immobilised, a failure, unable to preach or heal but it was there that he redeemed us".

He had no books or anything to celebrate Mass with but he found strength through frequent celebration of the Eucharist. From time to time, a sympathiser was able to smuggle in a tiny bottle of wine labelled 'stomach medicine'. His cell then became his 'cathedral' in the way our painting of him shows. With three drops of water and wine in one hand and a scrap

of bread in the other, he would celebrate Mass, relying on his memory for the prayers and readings.

After this experience, he was sent to a 're education camp' in the North for four years. There he continued to celebrate Mass secretly but this time with others around him. "At 9:30 in the evening I sat up on my bed with five other prisoners around me to celebrate the Mass by heart, as I had done when I was in solitary confinement. We then reserved the Eucharist in a cigarette box and, during the night, prisoners took it in turns to adore Jesus among us to heal our physical and mental suffering." Many lives were changed as a result of this. Even the camp guards began to speak to him and to confide in him, causing the authorities to change warders regularly so that they would not be 'contaminated'.

Cardinal Nguyen Van Thuan's experience of the Eucharist in prison emphasises the importance of 'sacrifice' in our understanding of the Eucharist. This is the central theme of each of our readings for the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi). In Exodus we have a description of Moses splashing the people with the blood of sacrificed animals as a sign of their relationship with God and their acceptance of his covenant. The Letter to the Hebrews reflects on this in the light of Christ's own self sacrifice on the cross and points out a key difference between ancient sacrifice and Christ's own sacrifice: the "blood of Christ" has transformed our "inner self", not just our actions.

Mark's Gospel shows us Jesus at the Last Supper "breaking the bread", indicating his own self sacrifice, and offering the cup of wine "the blood of the covenant which is to be poured out for many". At the heart of the Eucharist is God's love for us expressed through Christ's complete giving of himself. We however must be prepared to receive this gift of God to us in the same spirit. Cardinal Van Thuan understood the importance of being open to what God has to give us through the Eucharist from his own experience. His own suffering opened his life to the life that Jesus offered him through the Eucharist. This life that he experienced was then able to transform other lives.

Our scripture readings and Cardinal Van Thuan's lived experience remind us that the Eucharist (from the Greek word for 'giving thanks') means more than 'receiving Communion', more than a 'celebration', important of course as each of these are. It is about living in communion with God, the giving of every part of our life to God just as he gave himself completely to us in Christ. It is a life that Christ continues to give us, in "the bread that is broken", "the blood that is poured out for many" so that we may be able "to do our service to the living God."

References: all quotations are from Cardinal Nguyen Van Thuan's personal testimony in **Road to Hope**, a documentary produced by Salt and Light Media and available on Youtube. Cardinal Nguyen Van Thuan was released in 1991 and allowed to leave Vietnam but never to return. He died in Rome in 2002 and was declared 'Venerable' in 2007, the first step on the path to canonisation.
