24 August: Love that Risks: Creating Communities of Growth and Innovation







"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me ... "

One of my favourite TV shows when I was growing up was an action drama called Mission: Impossible. Each program would begin in the same way: a secret agent would receive a recorded message with his mission. This would outline an almost impossible task eg finding and rescuing another secret agent who was 'somewhere in Siberia'.

When we look at the way the life and mission of Jesus are presented in the gospels, we could say that he too was engaged in an impossible mission. We see this in this Sunday's Gospel where Jesus is rejected by his own home town of Nazareth. They accepted the fact that he had worked miracles and they appreciated the depth of his understanding and the power of his teaching but they rejected him. Why?

Trying to understand their reasons for rejecting Jesus can give us an understanding of who Jesus is and what he came to give us. It also points us towards our own share in Jesus' prophetic mission because, in response to their rejection, Jesus quoted the saying, "A prophet is only despised in his own country among his own relations and in his own house." This links him to the way in which he is introduced at the beginning of Mark's Gospel through John the Baptist who had said that someone more powerful than he was coming who would baptise "not with water but with the Holy Spirit".

What they could not accept was that someone who was 'one of them' was unique and worthy of a special relationship. They knew him; they knew his family. They knew that he had worked as a handyman in the town, someone who "cannot expound discipline or judgement and is not found among the rulers" (Sirach 38:33). In other words, they thought that they had him worked out and could safely ignore whatever demands he made of them. It is no wonder that "Jesus was amazed at their lack of faith".

Here we see the 'impossible mission' that Jesus had. It was a mission with no human logic to it. Even though his teaching and his miracles "amazed" people, what he wanted and valued wasn't their 'amazement' but their "faith", their trust in him so that their lives could be reshaped. He was a prophet in a completely different way to John the Baptist and the great prophets of the Old Testament. They spoke the Word of God but Jesus, as John puts it in the Prologue to his Gospel, is "the Word made flesh". They rejected him, and later others would reject him, because his life couldn't be placed in a category that they were familiar with. How could, for example, someone who was respected as a teacher of the Law also be the guide and friend of people outside the Law or who rejected it?

Through our Baptism we are all called to be prophets, "giving glory to God by our life", as we hear in the Dismissal at the end of Mass. Our mission is 'impossible' in a way that is unique to our time, especially in once Christian societies like Australia. Our primary focus is not people who know nothing about Christ but people who 'know' about him, 'understand' him in some ways but have rejected him either consciously or through indifference.

There are many reasons for this widespread rejection of Christ, among them, the many examples of the way in which we, "the Church, the Body of Christ", have failed to be signs of Christ among us "the Word made flesh". Like the apostle Paul however, we can find strength even in our weakness, our failures and our limitations when we turn to Christ and pray for insight and the grace of perseverance and courage in the mission he has given us. "My grace is enough for you; my power is at its best in weakness.
